EYFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss respect, love, and care within personal and communal relationships. • Explore welcoming rituals in different religions, like infant baptism and naming ceremonies. • Reflect on personal experiences and religious teachings about individual uniqueness and worth. • Focus on the Nativity story and the significance of Christmas for Christians. • Connect the concept of God as Creator with stewardship of the world.
1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about love and belonging, welcome and marriage rituals, and symbols of belonging in various faith communities. • Understand Christian beliefs about God's character, forgiveness, and love, and reflect on personal implications. • Recognize Jewish practices, such as prayers, celebrations, and reflections on gratitude and remembrance. • Explore Christian beliefs about creation through the Genesis story and reflections on gratitude towards God. • Discuss the importance of caring for others, valuing every person, and prioritizing environmental care in both Christian and Jewish perspectives. •
2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify sacred places of worship and understand the significance of key objects in those places. • Comprehend the importance of Jesus' birth and reflect on how Christians celebrate Christmas. • Understand the concept of "good news" in Christianity and explore Jesus' teachings of forgiveness, peace, and friendship. • Recognize the significance of Easter in Christianity, including its connection to Incarnation and Salvation, and how it's celebrated. • Learn about the Shahadah, the 99 Names of Allah, stories of the Prophet Muhammad, and the Five Pillars of Islam, including prayer (salah).
3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the Creation story from Genesis and understand Christian beliefs about God as the Creator and humanity's role as stewards of creation. • Explore the story of Noah and the covenant God made with him, understanding the concept of covenant and its significance. • Understand the significance of Surah 1 in the Qur'an for Muslims' understanding of God, and explore practices like salah and fasting during Ramadan. • Explore the significance of Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, and the Exodus story in Jewish belief, reflecting on themes of reflection, repentance, and freedom. • Understand the concept of salvation in Christianity and explore the events of Holy Week through the perspective of Mary, the mother of Jesus. • Investigate religious beliefs about improving the world, explore teachings from various traditions, and learn about individuals and organizations inspiring positive change.
4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand the significance of the Trinity in Christianity and explore its symbolism in baptism. • Learn about Brahman and its manifestations in Hindu deities, along with the symbolism of the "Aum" symbol. • Understand the concept of dharma and how it shapes Hindu life in Britain, including celebrations like Diwali and Holi. • Explore the concept of salvation in Christianity and the significance of Holy Week events, including the reasoning behind calling Jesus' crucifixion day 'Good Friday'. • Explore the significance of Pentecost in Christianity and its connection to the concept of the kingdom of God, as well as the role of the Holy Spirit.

5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identify Hindu deities and their roles, exploring stories and festivals to understand beliefs about God.• Understand Muslim beliefs about God, Prophet Muhammad, and the Qur'an, and explore the significance of the Five Pillars in British Muslim life.• Explore the concept of Incarnation and the Messiah in Christianity through biblical narratives and Christmas celebrations.• Examine Jewish beliefs about God reflected in the Torah and the Torah's significance in Jewish life, including commandments and traditions.• Analyse Gospel texts to identify key teachings and explore their implications for Christian living, considering contemporary issues.• Compare Christian and Humanist beliefs on human nature and morality, reflecting on personal values and their impact on individuals and society.
6	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Explore interpretations of Genesis 1 in Christianity and compare them with scientific explanations of cosmology and evolution.• Define and discuss beliefs of theists, atheists, and agnostics, exploring reasons behind belief or disbelief in God.• Define Hindu concepts like dharma, karma, samsara, and moksha, and examine their influence on Hindu life and worldview.• Summarize Christian beliefs in Jesus' sacrificial death for salvation and its practical implications, including the celebration of Holy Communion.• Understand the concept of the kingdom of God in Christianity and its expressions through biblical parables and acts of love and service.• Describe how religious beliefs about life after death and God's presence help individuals cope with life's challenges and suffering.
